
We are now open in Scotland with Glasgow & Dundee open and recruiting

Chris Lippiatt is our new data co-ordinator



Please check eligibility carefully before consenting patients

Patients must have a new head and neck primary cancer to be eligible for the study

Patients with recurrence are not eligible

Has treatment already started? Recruitment and baseline procedures are to be completed after the patient has been given their diagnosis but before treatment starts

The exceptions to this rule are:

Where the diagnostic procedure is also the treatment (e.g. tonsillectomy or thyroidectomy). In this case baseline can be done up to one month after the procedure.

Where there is no treatment procedure (i.e. supportive care only) baseline can be done at any time, but ideally as close to diagnosis as possible.
