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

I am a Senior Lecturer in Oral & Maxillofacial Pathology at the University of Bristol and Lead Pathologist for Head and Neck 5000. The collection of biopsy material, together with linked blood and saliva samples from our patients, will help create one of largest biomedical resources dedicated to head and neck cancer in the UK. We hope that this valuable resource will support basic and translational research studies that will be of benefit to future head and neck patients. I will soon be contacting some of my pathology colleagues at our 78 sites to ask for help in transferring any outstanding tissue samples to Bristol. We will then begin to develop this important component of the Head and Neck 5000 study.

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
Head and Neck 5000 Database Manager

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Data Cleaning

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We have been busy cleaning study data; some of you will have already received your data queries while others have that to look forward to. Please keep an eye out for the query spreadsheets and the missing data reports which will be sent out very soon.

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We have a data lock coming up - please could you ensure that we have all outstanding Data Capture Forms and Queries returned as soon as possible. The data is required for the statistical analysis to take place.

A (Gentle) Reminder!

- Please ensure that you have printed ALL pages of the questionnaires, stapled them together in the correct order, and put the study number on at least one side of each page before giving them to patients. This helps stop a great deal of confusion and means we get back all the data we can use to enable accurate trial results.
- Please do not leave any empty sections on the Data Capture
 Forms. If information is unavailable or not applicable please write
 this on the form. If we see a blank box we will send you a data
 query! Let's avoid this!
- Lastly, please ensure that the additional 'About You' questions are only sent to patients who received the old version of the 'About You' questionnaire before Amendment 6. If version 3.2 of the 'About You' questionnaire has been given to the patient then the additional questions are not necessary as the latest version (v3.2) contains these.
